



We offer both "Low-Barrier" Emergency Shelter as well as Recuperative Care Shelter. ('low-barrier" = We serve people even when they have background & sobriety issues)

ADULT SHELTER: 249 BALDWIN AVENUE

"Low-Barrier" Emergency Shelter (Most barriers removed) No ID/ Sobriety/ Background Check, Trauma-informed approach, Embedded services through community partners such as medical, housing, behavioral and employment

RECUPERATIVE SHELTER: 1416 JOSLYN AVENUE

Inpatient "discharge to home" option for individual experiencing homelessness. Nurses provide patient monitoring and education. Person-centered connection to vital documents, legal and housing resources through intensive case management.

INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS

HOPE provides innovative programs to help guests navigate the process of returning to a home.

ADVOCACY
